## Report: 5.02 – Current Events

President Randall noted the following:

- Announced that Dr. Bob Carter will serve as the new senior vice president for health sciences and CEO of University of Utah Health. Dr. Carter will bear primary responsibility for setting the research and education vision for our academic health sciences center, building on the foundations laid by the medical pioneers and founders who came before him.
  - Dr. Carter is Massachusetts General Hospital's Neurosurgeon-In-Chief, a professor of neurosurgery and the William and Elizabeth Sweet Endowed Professor in Neuroscience at Harvard Medical School. With more than 18 years of experience as a researcher and instructor of neurosurgery at Harvard, and another seven years at the University of California, San Diego, where he served as chair of the faculty of the School of Medicine.
  - Dr. Carter also has deep experience in health care administration, helping to launch the integration of academic and clinical teams at Massachusetts General with Brigham and Women's Hospital earlier this year.
  - Dr. Carter will begin his work in mid-February.

### GRAY DECISION INTELLIGENCE TOOLS ROLLING OUT NOW

- Gray Decision Intelligence tools will support academic strategy, planning and evaluation efforts at the U.
- They provide access to information on student demand, program competition, and wages, skills and jobs associated with academic programs.
- Along with other critical institutional data at the U, the Gray DI tools can be used to evaluate and manage a successful academic program portfolio, thereby furthering student success.

# UNIVERSITY OF UTAH DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNICATION BREAKS BLOBAL TOP 30 SHANGHAI RANINGS FOR THE FIRST TIME

- Worldwide the department is ranked 29<sup>th</sup>. It is also ranked 17<sup>th</sup> among U.S. universities, one spot behind Cornell.
- No other Utah schools are included in the Communication rankings.
- Shanghai Ranking began to publish world university ranking by academic subjects in 2009. By introducing
  improved methodology, the Global Ranking of Academic Subjects (GRAS) was first published in 2017.
- The 2024 GRAS contains rankings of universities in 55 subjects across Natural Sciences, Engineering, Life Sciences, Medical Sciences and Social Sciences. More than 1,900 out of 5,000 universities across 96 countries and regions are listed in the rankings.
