

**AMENDMENT TO
MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE UTE INDIAN TRIBE AND
THE UNIVERSITY OF UTAH**

This Amendment to Memorandum of Understanding between the Ute Indian Tribe and the University of Utah (the “*Amendment*”) is entered into and effective as of the 31st day of March, 2025, by and between the Ute Indian Tribe (“*Tribe*”) and the University of Utah, a body politic and corporate of the State of Utah (“*University*”).

RECITALS

A. The Tribe and the University entered into that certain Memorandum of Understanding dated March 3, 2020 (the “*Memorandum of Understanding*”) to memorialize the long and valued relationship between the Tribe and the University and their mutual desire to support and honor the Tribe by assisting tribal youth in the pursuit of college education and allowing the University to use the Ute name as a representative symbol of the University; and

B. The Tribe and the University desire to continue their long-standing association as outlined in the Memorandum of Understanding with further discussion about the best way to accomplish the purposes set forth in the Memorandum of Understanding.

C. The Tribe and the University therefore wish to amend the Memorandum of Understanding for an additional year while they engage in such discussions.

AGREEMENT

NOW THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

1. The term of the Memorandum of Understanding is hereby extending by one (1) additional year until March 2, 2026.

2. This Amendment shall not be deemed to amend or modify the Memorandum of Understanding in any manner except as specifically provided for herein. Each of the definitions set forth in the Memorandum of Understanding shall apply to the defined terms used in this Amendment. The Memorandum of Understanding, as amended by this Amendment, shall be and remain in full force and effect, and enforceable in accordance with its terms.

3. This Amendment may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which will be considered an original, and which together will constitute one and the same instrument. This Amendment may be executed by facsimile signature, including electronic pdf, which will be treated as an original signature.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have caused this Amendment to be executed by their duly authorized representatives effective as of the day and year first written above.
